

Br. Luis Ramos Enters the Novitiate


The Marist Brothers of the United States Province celebrated the entry of Br. Luis Ramos to the Marist Brothers Novitiate on August 19 during a prayer service at Mount Saint Michael Academy in the Bronx, New York.

Br. Luis previously attended high school at Marist-founded Mount Saint Michael Academy. He received his first sacraments as part of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults Program at Iona College in New Rochelle, New York, where he graduated in 2015 with a bachelor's degree in religious studies.

During his college years, he was actively involved in the Marist Young Adult Program. After graduating from college, he spent one year living and working

Walking the Camino



The Camino de Santiago, also known as The Way of Saint James, is a network of pilgrims' ways leading to the shrine of the apostle of Saint James the Great. The shrine is located in northwestern Spain at the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, where tradition says the remains of the saint are buried. Each year, many pilgrims follow the Camino de Santiago as a retreat for their spiritual growth. Over the summer, Br. Todd Patenaude, joined by two other Marist pilgrims, embarked on the journey of the Camino.

Wrote Br. Todd, "Walking the Camino was a fantastic experience for all who participated. We made Jesus known and loved every day. I can't even begin to explain what an awakening the experience has been for me and for my companions on the journey.

So many people I've met are curious as to what a Brother is, and I had so many conversations about faith, religion, and spirituality with different people along the way. It is clear to me why God wanted me there. Alice, a pilgrim from Pennsylvania, asked me 'Did you know you were going to be teaching so many people on the Camino when you decided to walk it? Because you really are teaching us a lot! I love talking to and walking with you.'

The Marist Brothers Center in Esopus, New York, is our Marist center for evangelization in the Province of the United States. Often, people are unclear about the nature of our mission. Evangelization means to announce the good news of God's incarnate love. We speak to spread the Gospel, not simply by our words, but more importantly by our deeds. All of our programs and efforts are focused on this mission.

The Advent season calls each of us to "prepare the way of the Lord." How can we best respond to this call? Here in Esopus we provide young people with a place where they feel safe, loved, and accepted for who they are. We provide opportunities for them to discover their God-given talents. We also challenge them to use those talents to make the world a better place: in effect, to build the Kingdom of God.



Our Marist mission doesn't end in Esopus. Every group that leaves the center is commissioned to go forth into the world to evangelize, to announce to others the power of God's love, and to give witness to that which they have seen and heard. The Gospels tell us that God is love. Love abounds in Esopus.



Advent gives all of us a reason to contemplate the words of theologian Meister Eckhart: "What good is it if Mary gave birth to Jesus 2,000 years ago, if I do not do it in my own time? We are all meant to be mothers of God, for God is always needing to be born."

This Advent, as we anticipate the incarnation of our God's love into our own lives, let us give thanks for the gift of our Marist mission.

LaValla Weekend Retreat:



This year marked the sixth-annual LaValla Weekend Retreat at the Marist Brothers Center in Esopus, New York. Students from Archbishop Molloy High School, Queens, New York; Christopher Columbus High School, Miami, Florida; Marist High School, Bayonne, New Jersey; Marist

High School, Chicago, Illinois; Mount St. Michael Academy, Bronx, New York; St. Joseph Academy, Brownsville, Texas; St. Joseph Regional High School, Montvale, New Jersey; and Roselle Catholic High School, Roselle, New Jersey, participated.

Similar to previous LaValla Retreats, students spent time doing service work on various projects around the Esopus grounds. Instead of starting a new project to begin and finish throughout the weekend, groups spread out around the retreat center cleaning up and fixing projects from past years' retreats.

They also took part in a day-long natural disaster and relief simulation. The goal of



the exercise was to give students insights on the real-life struggles many people have had to go through after the recent tragedies of hurricanes in the Caribbean and earthquakes in Mexico. Students were split into groups, or "families," for the weekend, and assumed various roles throughout the simulation experience.



At the end of the weekend, each student group was given \$100 to use as seed money for fundraising efforts for the Province's campaign to help the Marist centers in Puerto Rico and Mexico. Br. Owen Ormsby, Executive Director of the MBCE, encouraged the students to start and lead fundraising efforts in their individual communities. With the help of these students and the Marist schools around the United States, the Province's campaign raised over \$10,000!



22nd General Chapter Meeting

Ninety-four participants from around the Marist World joined together in September for the 22nd General Chapter Meeting in Rionegro, Colombia.

The participants from the United States Province were Brothers Sean Sammon, Patrick McNamara, Daniel O'Riordan, Ben Consigli, and Al Rivera. Br. Luis Ramos, who joined the Marist USA Novitiate in August, also was in Colombia spending time at the Novitiate in Medellin.




The intention of the General Chapter Meeting process was to invite Marists, both Brothers and lay people, to see where there could be potential in the world today to spread the Marist charism. The Chapter Assembly was




charged with the task of indicating the way for "a new LaValla." Br. Emili Turu, current Superior

General of the Marist Institute, emphasized this by saying the goal of the meeting was "to make La Valla relevant today, at the beginning of the 21st century, as a new world is emerging."

Some highlights from this year's General Chapter Meeting included attending mass led by Pope Francis, visiting young people



in cultural centers around Colombia, and concluding the celebration of the bicentennial of the Institute. Delegates also elected Br. Ernesto Sanchez-Barba as the new Superior general and Br. Luis Carlos Gutierrez Blanco as the new Vicar General. Br. Ben Consigli, from the USA Province, was also elected as one of the new members of the General Council.

IN MEMORIAM



Brother Fabian Mayor

July 7, 2017

Br. Fabian Mayor, FMS passed away on July 7, a month after he celebrated his 60th Jubilee as a Marist Brother. He was 79 years old.

He entered the Marist Brothers Novitiate in 1957 and professed his first vows on July 26, 1958. After completing a BA in history at Marist College, Poughkeepsie,



New York, he began his teaching career at Saint Joseph High School in Lowell, Massachusetts. He professed his final vows on July 11, 1963, and earned a Master of Arts degree in history from Saint John's University, New York, New York, in 1969.

Br. Fabian earned further graduate degrees in computer science from Miami Dade College, Miami, Florida, and in global studies from Florida International University, Miami, both in 2000.

He had a distinguished career as a teacher at the following schools: Central Catholic High School, Wheeling, West Virginia; Marist Catholic High School, Eugene, Oregon; Bishop Dubois High School, New York, New York; Marist High School, Chicago, Illinois; Marist International High School, Kobe, Japan; Fr. Duenas High School, Mangilao, Guam; Christopher Columbus High School, Miami, Florida; and Mount Saint

Michael Academy, Bronx, New York.

He also served as deputy principal of Christopher Columbus High School in Miami and as a social animator of Lazarus House Ministries in Lawrence, Massachusetts. Prior to his death, Br. Fabian was retired and living at Champagnat Hall in the Bronx.



Brother Robert LeClerc



Br. Robert LeClerc, FMS, a member of the Marist Brothers for 67 years, died on August 26, at De LaSalle Hall in Lincroft, New Jersey. He was 84 years old.

Br. Robert became a postulant with the Marist Brothers in 1949 and entered the Marist Brothers Novitiate at Tyngsboro, Massachusetts, in 1950 before professing first vows in 1951. After completing his religious and academic studies at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, New York, he began his ministry serving as a teacher at Central Catholic High School in Lawrence, Massachusetts. He also served as a teacher at Mount Saint Michael Academy, Bronx, New York; Cardinal Spellman High School, Bronx; Marist Catholic High School, Eugene, Oregon; and Our Lady of Lourdes High School, Poughkeepsie, New York.

He professed his final vows in 1956 and earned a master's degree in mathematics, physics, and chemistry

from Saint John's University in New York, New York, in 1960. Br. Robert retired to the Marist Brothers community at Champagnat Hall in the Bronx in 2007 and lived his last two years at De LaSalle Hall.
